Highlights of Interim Associate Rector's Work since our last vestry meeting:

Worship and Liturgy:

Regular Worship Schedule: Carried out regular Sunday schedule of 8 and 10 AM Eucharists, Wednesday 5:30 PM Eucharists, and Ash Wednesday services.

Bulletins: I have taken over the task of preparing the bulletins for All Saints' worship services.

Interim & Christian Formation:

Missional Theology: After the heritage piece, the next interim task focuses on mission. I have designed a process for developing a mission statement, a vision statement, a values statement and a motto for All Saints. It has been posted on Trello. I can start offering my parts during Sunday forums whenever the vestry is ready.

Course on African American Theology: In conversation with the Truth and Reconciliation Committee, I have agreed to offer a short version of my university course on African American Theology and Ethics. So far we are halfway through the course. Here is a draft of the syllabus:
