Highlights of Interim Associate Rector's Work since our last vestry meeting:

Worship and Liturgy:

Regular Worship Schedule: Carried out regular Sunday schedule of 8 and 10 AM Eucharists and Wednesday 5:30 PM Eucharists.

<u>Bulletins:</u> I have taken over the task of preparing the bulletins for All Saints' worship services. All Holy Week and special service bulletins are complete.

Interim & Christian Formation:

Baptismal Preparation: I've been coordinating with families who will have children baptized on Pentecost.

<u>Missional Theology</u>: After the heritage piece, the next interim task focuses on mission. I have designed a process for developing a mission statement, a vision statement, a values statement and a motto for All Saints. It has been posted on Trello. I will start offering my parts during Sunday forums On March 26, 2023.

<u>Course on African American Theology</u>: In conversation with the Truth and Reconciliation Committee, I have agreed to offer a short version of my university course on African American Theology and Ethics. The course will conclude on March 29, 2023. Here is a draft of the syllabus:
