

The First Lesson

2 Kings 2:1-12

Now when the Lord was about to take Elijah up to heaven by a whirlwind, Elijah and Elisha were on their way from Gilgal. Elijah said to Elisha, "Stay here; for the Lord has sent me as far as Bethel." But Elisha said, "As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So they went down to Bethel. The company of prophets who were in Bethel came out to Elisha, and said to him, "Do you know that today the Lord will take your master away from you?" And he said, "Yes, I know; keep silent." Elijah said to him, "Elisha, stay here; for the Lord has sent me to Jericho." But he said, "As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So they came to Jericho. The company of prophets who were at Jericho drew near to Elisha, and said to him, "Do you know that today the Lord will take your master away from you?" And he answered, "Yes, I know; be silent." Then Elijah said to him, "Stay here; for the Lord has sent me to the Jordan." But he said, "As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So the two of them went on. Fifty men of the company of prophets also went, and stood at some distance from them, as they both were standing by the Jordan. Then Elijah took his mantle and rolled it up, and struck the water; the water was parted to the one side and to the other, until the two of them crossed on dry ground. When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Tell me what I may do for you, before I am taken from you." Elisha said, "Please let me inherit a double share of your spirit." He responded, "You have asked a hard thing; yet, if you see me as I am being taken from you, it will be granted you; if not, it will not." As they continued walking and talking, a chariot of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them, and Elijah ascended in a whirlwind into heaven. Elisha kept watching and crying out, "Father, father! The chariots of Israel and its horsemen!" But when he could no longer see him, he grasped his own clothes and tore them in two pieces.

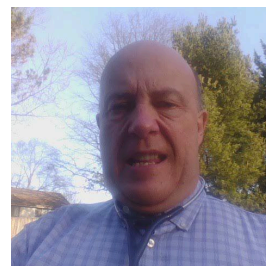

Thank you from St. Mary's Chapter - Many thanks go to many people for making the Candlemas Festival on February 3 happen. We can't name everyone, but we want to recognize especially our chefs and their team, the St. Mary's bakers and decorators, clergy and support staff, the Altar Guild, the choir, the docents and greeters, the individuals who volunteered in various ways great and small, and to the parishioners who participated in food purchases and celebrating the Candlemas Service. We're still pulling together figures for revenue so we haven't yet determined how much funds were raised. We do know that over 100 lunch/dinners were sold and lots of folks visited the Great Hall for hot beverages & cookies. There were 69 people attending the Candlemas Service. Over 80 people, mostly non-parishioners, visited the church during the open house and about a dozen had candles blessed. At the first candle-blessing session Rev. Scholarship Opportunities for HS or College Students - In the 1820's, a group of All Saints' Episcopal Church members donated funds to establish an orphanage to support and educate needy children. In the 1940's, the community's need for the orphan house declined, so the orphanage was closed, and the sale proceeds were used to establish an educational fund.

Our board strives to award scholarships to Frederick County residents based on need and promise as we administer this fund. Historically, 10 - 15 awards, ranging from \$500 to \$2500, have been given each year to one immediate family member at a time. Available only at the undergraduate level, these awards may be renewed by students reapplying each year while still an undergraduate.

Completed applications (with required supporting documentation) are due by **March 31st**. Please review the checklists at the end of the application and carefully follow the instructions. Incomplete applications or applications received after March 31st will not be considered. We will notify you if your scholarship is considered, and we will send you several questions to answer in a small video that you will send to us in place of in-person interviews. February and March Outreach: Lenten Rice Bowl Collection

In the months of February and March, we will hold our annual Lenten Rice Bowl Collection and we have selected the “Heritage at Work” program at the Catoctin Furnace Historical Society to be the recipient of our Rice Bowl funds.

Catoctin Furnace Historical Society preserves, commemorates, and studies the history of the industrial village (between the 1770s and the 1840s), and has been instrumental in bringing the truth of the early enslaved laborers into the open. It is the mission of CFHS to highlight the enslaved workers' long-neglected contributions and repair the economic damage caused by the institution of race-based slavery in the US.

To that end, the “Heritage at Work” program provides internships in the historical building trades to at-risk students of the Victor Cullen Center in Sabillasville, in cooperation with the State of Maryland Department of Juvenile Services. Three days a week, the students receive training and mentorship as they work to restore and renovate the historic structures at CFHS. These skills not only prepare them for careers in the building trades, but also give them experiences of accomplishment, self-confidence and hope for their future.

Specifically, our Rice Bowl funds will be used for the Trades Instructor salary, stipends for the student apprentices, transportation costs for the students and the purchase of building supplies.

In addition to the collection of Rice Bowl funds, All Saints Church has the desire to educate ourselves about our past, in relation to slavery here in Frederick and attempt to remedy the economic hardship caused by systemic slavery. Therefore, we will be offering a series of speakers over the five Sundays of Lent from 9:00 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. in the Great Hall. Our speakers and their topics will be:

Feb. 18: Elizabeth Comer, archeologist and President of the Catoctin Furnace Historical Society, will speak about the history of Catoctin Furnace and the present work being done at the CFHS.

Feb. 25: The film: *Forged in Slavery*, produced by the Smithsonian Institution, will be shown.

March 3: Ranger Mark Spurrier, Manager of Cunningham Falls State Park (which includes Catoctin Furnace Historic Site) and “Heritage at Work” instructor, will speak about the program and how it has benefited the park and the crew members.

March 10: Dean Herrin, Ph.D., former Chief Historian of the National Capital Region, National Park Service, now retired, Dean is a member of AARCH (African American Resources, Cultural and Heritage Society) and is the former NPS coordinator of the Catoctin Center for Regional Studies at Frederick Community College. Dean will speak about the first African American schools in Frederick after emancipation in Maryland in 1864, their challenges and achievements, and a few connections with All Saints Church.

March 17: Amanda Venable Kramer, Museum Manager at Rose Hill Manor Parks and Museums, will discuss the connections between Rose Hill and All Saints Church, including the experience of the enslaved of the Johnson and Grahame families.
